PASTORAL LETTER

“He hasn’t even been born yet”

This time last year, some supermarkets were coming under fire in the media for putting hot cross buns on their shelves in early December. And no-one put the case against it better than the woman who rang in and said: “Hang on – He hasn’t even been born yet!”

The birth of our Saviour may be the most joyous event in the Christian calendar, but even if you put Advent, the Nativity and Epiphany together you are looking at six weeks, at most. The vast majority of the year is taken up with Jesus’ ministry, crucifixion and resurrection, and their world-shattering implications. And I see nothing wrong with that.

We also have to accept that every year, the commercialisation of Christmas seems to begin another week earlier. Not so long ago, there was not a mention of the festive season – even the launch of the John Lewis commercial – till we had put away our poppies. Then the cutoff date was Bonfire Night. More recently it has become Hallowe’en. Increasingly the pub and hotel chains are putting up Christmas trees at the start of November, if not before. And you can book a Christmas dinner from late August.

I’m sure we have all been looking at our Christmas card and present lists – not least to see how we can save on postage. Old-timers will be trying to remember which Sunday is the one when they should stir up their Christmas pudding (if they still make their own). But we all know, deep down, that the festive season that matters starts with Advent Sunday.

We may resent the way big business has tried to take over one of the two holiest times of our year. We may deplore even more that we are all being urged to spend money we haven't got on things nobody really needs, at just a time when more and more people are falling into poverty and homelessness.

Most of us will have a favourite charity – Trussell, Crisis, the Salvation Army or whatever – through which we can hope to bring the true message of Christmas to people who simply cannot afford to celebrate it. And at our Carols on Candlelight on 21 December – there's no morning service that day, remember - we shall be supporting Doctors Without Frontiers, working to save lives in war zones where the people have less than nothing.

But none of this means that, when the time comes, we should soft-pedal on the sheer joy of the Christian Christmas. The richness of our faith brings tears to our eyes as we sing those carols we love so much, and hear once again Luke's magical description of the Nativity. Yes, we know what lies ahead for our Lord, but for a few wonderful days we can celebrate with our families, enjoy one mince pie too many – and consign those hot cross buns to the freezer.

A very happy Christmas to you all, and every good thing you would wish yourselves for the New Year.

WORDS OF WISDOM

I did say that we had come to the end of our exploration of Luke's Gospel. But along comes (rather like that extra bus you weren't expecting) another star piece of Luke's genius in telling the inspiring story of Jesus. It's his chapter 21, the last before he takes us into the two fateful chapters that lead to the Crucifixion.

I am sure you recall the way Luke depends so much on Mark, that we can tell that he had a copy of Mark on his desk as he wrote. He turns to Mark's chapter 13 and, as usual, tweaks it to suit his own approach.

To many it is a scary chapter because, on the surface, you can read it as if all the bad things can be put down to God's intention. That is not the case: Jesus is simply saying that God's kingdom will not come about immediately, and while we wait and hope for that to happen, evils will occur: wars between nations, insurrections, earthquakes, plagues and dreadful portents from the heavens.

Followers of Jesus will be persecuted, even by members of their own families; they will be brought before 'kings and governors' (i.e. as in a court of law). When this happens, says Jesus, you are not to worry about your defence – 'I will give you words and wisdom' and you will cope. By your endurance, your spiritual lives will be deepened.'

Jesus (with Luke as his editor, as it were) is pointing out that, in this self-centred world, some people in power will act in cruel ways and many innocent people will suffer. This is not God's will, but just how things are. The followers of Jesus will be safe. God's care of them is always to be relied on. They need not be afraid.

The take-away for us? Simply that if we are on God's side, then God is on ours. We can live confidently because we have God's love, whatever the circumstances. That, in a nutshell, is the Christmas message!

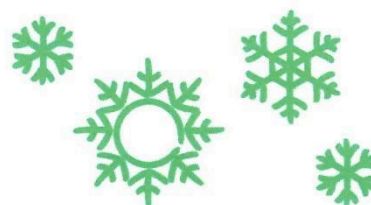

MEDECINS SANS FRONTIERES (MSF) **(The church's charity for 2025)**

WARNING.

These statements from MSF could be described as political

A ceasefire has been agreed in Gaza. It is a moment of overwhelming relief and hope for both the people of Gaza and the families of the Israeli hostages.

But an agreement does not undo the immense suffering experienced by so many. Two years of catastrophic violence have left deep scars. More than 67,000 people have lost their lives during this genocide, including 15 of our own MSF colleagues.

Families displaced from their homes on multiple occasions are now experiencing another devastation: returning to find nothing left, their homes and sometimes whole neighbourhoods razed to the ground.

What is happening in Gaza?

Prior to the ceasefire, our teams have seen: the deliberate targeting of medics and hospitals; the use of starvation as a weapon of war with a blockade starving people of food, water, fuel and medical supplies; the militarisation of aid, and the massacre of starving people queuing for aid.

In short, we are witnessing a genocide.

Through deliberate actions — including forced displacement, annexation, and mass killings — Israel is systematically destroying the conditions necessary for Palestinian life.

Much of Gaza's civilian infrastructure has been intentionally destroyed. Hospitals have been completely overwhelmed and have faced running out of critical supplies. Some medical facilities have been hit by indiscriminate bombing while others have been under siege.

We are witnessing a campaign of ethnic cleansing as the very fabric of society and Palestinian life is being wiped away in Gaza.

This campaign not only displaces Palestinians on a massive scale but also seeks to deny them — and future generations — their right of safe return, effectively erasing entire communities from the map.

Supply shortage and famine in Gaza

Israeli authorities have deliberately choked Gaza, imposing a total siege, with severe restrictions on fuel, water, food, and medical supplies. A policy of collective punishment, including starvation by design, has achieved its brutal objective – famine has been declared.

Infectious diseases – including diarrhoea, respiratory infections and hepatitis – are increasingly reported across Gaza. Access to safe, clean drinking water is particularly difficult, exacerbating living conditions, hygiene and health issues. Infected wounds are common with patients facing the double hit of unsanitary living conditions and a healthcare system that is unable to provide the in-hospital treatment and support that they need.

Pregnant mothers struggle to access maternity care and delivery rooms, leading to dangerous childbirth complications.

Through the Gaza Humanitarian Foundation, launched on 27 May, humanitarian aid, especially food, is being weaponised. It is being used as bait to forcibly displace people, to meet military objectives, or blocked entirely. Aid is not a bargaining chip. It is a lifeline. Denying it is collective punishment – a war crime.

What is MSF calling for?

“We are not sure that words can save lives, but we know that silence can certainly kill.”

These are the words spoken by Dr James Orbinski, as he accepted the Nobel Peace Prize on behalf of MSF 25 years ago.

As a medical humanitarian organisation, MSF not only treats the wounded, but also speaks out about what we see and do.

MSF is an independent, impartial and neutral humanitarian organisation. We operate based on medical need alone, going wherever that is greatest.

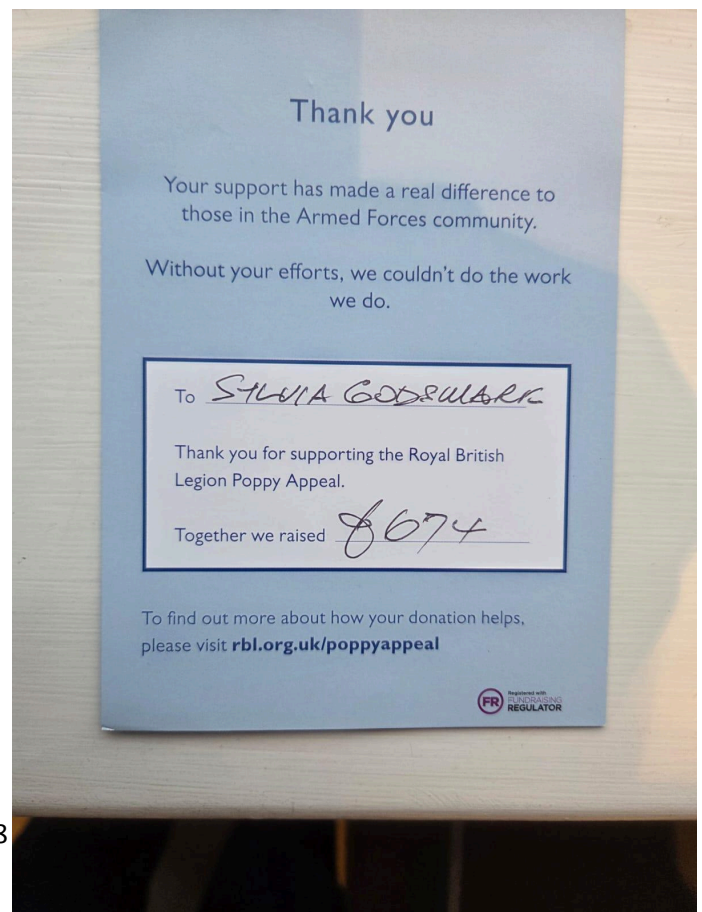
